OLHSA Makes Community Mini-Grant Awards



Oakland Livingston Human Service Agency (OLHSA), the Community Action Agency serving Oakland and Livingston Counties, MI, has announced their OLHSA Community Mini-Grant Initiative awards for innovative projects. These projects aim to bridge the gap between employers and the low income community, build capacity for families within the community, increase community development and help to streamline services to better serve clients. A total funding request of \$77,774.00 was received. We appreciate the extensive work of the proposal review panel who recommended six projects for a funding total of \$57,772.00.

The following projects were awarded:

- Big Brothers and Sisters of Livingston County—This project will partner young individuals with business mentors that will teach new skills and the importance of education to broaden their vision of the options available for their future.
- Mend on the Move—Through jewelry making and mentoring, this project proposes to build the self-esteem and confidence of low-income women survivors of abuse so they can move towards independence and healing.
- Life Beyond Re-Entry—This initiative bridges the gap between employers and ex-offenders, by empowering the participants with the knowledge, skills, and mindset necessary to obtain employment and remain crime free.
- G.I.R.D.L.E. —G.I.R.D.L.E.'s program seeks to improve the quality of life for at risk adolescent and teenage girls through skillful and intentional mentoring, while improving family dynamics.
- Micah 6—This program invests in and expands offerings of pop-up markets in the Pontiac community, to better engage a larger customer base of people in need of access to healthy produce.
- Camp Fire Southeast Michigan—Camp Fire's program will assist youth in Pontiac, MI with developing skills that will help them to improve their income by becoming more financially literate, improve their leadership skills, and foster youth entrepreneurship both now and in the future.

OLHSA staff reports they are excited to see the impact these forward-thinking approaches will have on local communities and families. OLHSA has the mission to empower families and communities to gain the knowledge, skills and resources needed to improve their quality of life. Its vision is to break the cycle of poverty, reaching the day when all families and communities thrive. The mini-grant awards will support OLHSA's mission and enhance our communities.

WCMU Public Radio of Central Michigan University reports that they raised \$68,000 in donations for low income heating assistance during their Warm Hearts, Warm Homes fundraiser in December 2018. The donations were matched by Consumers Energy Foundation (\$50,000) and Isabella Bank (\$18,000) and will be distributed to the Community Action Agency that serves the county from which the donation originated. The popular campaign reached its goal a day and a half earlier than scheduled has proved to be an effective way for WCMU listeners to support their public radio station and help neighbors in need at the same time.
