River Rouge, Redford, Highland Park residents earn Volunteer Awards

Eighty-seven year old **Reletha Moch** of River Rouge, **Monica King** of Redford, and **Carlton Clyburn** of Highland Park were recognized for making positive changes in their communities at the Michigan Community Action Awards event at the Capitol in Lansing April 30.

Moch has been a volunteer for the Wayne Metro CAA for more than 20 years and also works with a number of other River Rouge service organizations. **Clyburn** volunteers in the Male Readers for Leaders program and formed My Brother's Keeper to help young males with opportunities to succeed. **King** has worked with homeless youth in Wayne Metro's KEY (Keeping an Eye on Youth) Program for more than six years, helping foster care kids and donating hats, mittens and shoes.
